EARLY HEAD START




THE ABRAHAM FAMILY

The Abraham family enrolled into the Children’s Coalition Early Head Start program in October of 2018, starting out in the home base program. Fredrick Jr and Jessie were a part of the home-based program. Fredrick transitioned out of the program through home base and Jessie enrolled into the Hall Street center base program where she transitioned out as well. The baby of the family Jacey is currently enrolled in the center-based program. The family came to Early Head Start to provide their children with a safe learning environment while father worked, and mother was able to complete college courses with a clear mind knowing her children were in safe hands. Anastasia stated one of her favorite things about

our childcare, saying “Whenever there was a problem, even something small, everyone called to inform me as well as provide reassurance that everything would be okay”. The children are not the only ones to make achievements, Anastasia has completed her bachelor’s degree with plans to apply to ULM’s pharmacy program. This dream was one she called “delayed but not denied. It’s given me a better opportunity to provide and give my children an even better life”. The Abrahams continue to grow and amaze those around them. Mom calls her children, “very smart and thanks to you all I feel they are very advanced for their age”. The Abraham family is very thankful for their journey with EHS, as mother can advance her education while being an amazing mother.

Teachers talk to them about the shape and the color as well as the taste and how it benefits our health. The garden and outdoor learning center offers learning opportunities to children and their families in our community.
